I seem to remember my first day being quite exciting, seeing my usual friends from primary school and then meeting others. I'm sure we had a large assembly where we met the headteacher, Mr Bower. My form group was Mrs Fawcett's.

I had lots of teachers throughout my time at Woldgate. Spanish teachers Mrs Jones and Mrs Russell were fantastic. Miss Bradshaw was a great history teacher, as was Miss Meadows. Mr and Mrs Macdonald were (and surprisingly still are) my parents!

English - Miss Stanley was very inspiring - she was a big fan of Gothic literature. The PE staff were great too, especially as I played for the school football and cricket teams throughout. Mr Cheetam and Mr Clark.

I had a very positive time at Woldgate - as a keen musician it was great to use the recording studio and the music staff were very good.
