My time at Woldgate was a very happy one. I remember feeling very grown up on my first day in my smart new uniform as I cycled past my old junior school & then feeling very small when I arrived at "big school" - all of the other pupils seemed like giants!

I threw myself into a whole host of extra-curricular activities including gymnastics, drama & choir & I frequently played piano pieces at school concerts, prizegivings & assemblies, which I loved.

My favourite teacher was David Tucker, he was the reason I chose A level geography, & I am still in touch with him today, in fact I met up with him only a few weeks ago.

My best friend at Woldgate was Kath Crusher, we first became friends at Pocklington junior school when we were 8 - & nearly 50 years on we are still the best of friends.
